 - Energy/Climate






Incorporation of Smart Growth

- 1. Encourage mixed-use neighborhoods.
- 2. Enable a diverse mix of housing types
- 3. Prioritize infill and redevelopment of existing buildings
- 4. Provide well-planned, equitable, and accessible public spaces.
- 5. Encourage compact neighborhood design and concentrated development
- 6. Preserve open space, agricultural resources, and natural resources.
- 7. Prioritize transportation options such as walking, cycling, and public transportation.
- 8. Promote climate resiliency and adaptation.
- 9. Build on unique traits to create an attractive and welcoming community.
- 10. Engage in an inclusive, collaborative public planning process.
